


Community Development & Public Relations *July 2013*

Dr. Michel Sucher, Medical Director for CBI, provides a practical and simple overview of how addiction is defined as a disease.





Skyline High School substance abuse prevention workshops

The Mesa Prevention Alliance partnered with Skyline High School to provide substance abuse prevention workshops for 650 incoming freshman to aid in the transition from middle school to high school. The workshops were led by the Alliance Youth Peer Leaders and the Mesa Explorers (Mesa Police Department Youth Training Program). Each workshop highlighted the risks and consequences of using substances such as alcohol, marijuana, and synthetic drugs and also provided the students with refusal skills information. Community Education & Training

July 2013

CBI provides community education and training for emergency responders, community partners, law enforcement, schools and the criminal justice system. The focus of our workshops presented an overview of agency services, signs and symptoms of drug use and emerging drug trends.

The following Education & Training workshops were provided during the month of July:

- 75 EMTs, Paramedics, Firefighters from Scottsdale and surrounding area at Scottsdale Healthcare –Osborn & Shea emergency responders learned about synthetic drugs such as bath salts and spice and the harmful effects, and resources at two scheduled trainings on Wednesday, July 10th
- **50 Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) volunteers** learned about latest drug trends, addiction and CBI services at the Supreme Court on Friday, July 12th
- 30 Gila River Health Care staff learned about latest drug trends and behaviors on Wednesday, July 17th
- 150 Perry High School faculty members from the Chandler School District learned about synthetic and opiate drug trends/behaviors at training on Thursday, July 18th
- 60 Phoenix Union High School District, School Resource Officers (SRO's) learned about synthetic and opiate drug behaviors/trends at training on Monday, July 22nd.
- 60 staff from Jewish Family and Children's Services (JFCS) learned the latest on synthetic and opiate drugs at a class hosted at Bill Wilson Hall on Wednesday, July 24th
- 18 Riverview High School staff in the Mesa Public School District learned about synthetic drug and opiates as part of the Parents in the Know Parents Commission program on Wednesday, July 31st
- 15 Superstition High School staff in the Mesa Public School District learned about synthetic drug and opiates as part of the Parents in the Know Parents Commission program on Wednesday, July 31st
